

Art Along the Rivers:

A Bicentennial Celebration

October 3, 2021–January 9, 2022



In conjunction with the 200th anniversary of Missouri's statehood, *Art Along the Rivers: A Bicentennial Celebration* explores the remarkable artwork produced and collected over 1,000 years in the region surrounding St. Louis. The exhibition presents more than 150 objects from Missouri as far north as Hannibal, west to Hermann, and south through the Old Mines area. It also encompasses the Illinois region along the eastern bank of the Mississippi River, from Cairo north through Carbondale and Alton. Although the region that has shaped the exhibition's objects is small, it has played an outsized role in the history of North America due to the confluence of powerful rivers and major trails and routes within its borders.



The Saint Louis Art Museum is excited to partner with Missouri River Relief and Greenway Network to present a virtual sneak peek of the *Art Along the Rivers: A Bicentennial Celebration* exhibition.

Beth Rubin, Research Assistant, American Art, will provide a brief overview of the exhibition and highlight several of the more than 150 works of art on view.
